

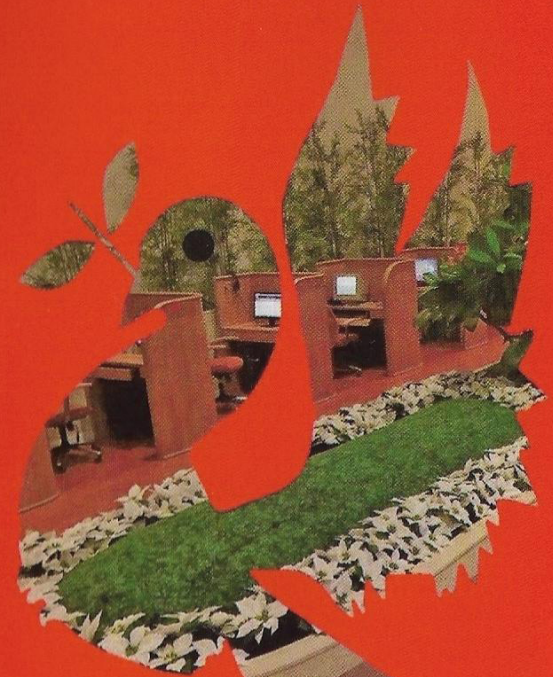

Welcome to the Nehru Centre Library. We hope you like the wide open, well-lit, cosy, reading space and our every-growing collection of books and journals that is accessible to everyone.

In 1977, when the Nehru Centre Library began, it was just a modest collection of 2500 books on Indology, meant for researchers building the immensely informative Discovery of India Exposition that would present Pandit Nehru's vision of India to future generations.

In 1991, as the collection grew, the library was shifted to the basement of the Planetarium and welcomed academicians, scholars and researchers. Later, it was introduced to the general public as a reference library with emphasis on the astronomy collection.

With the increase in readers' interest in new subjects like the environment, technology, applied sciences, etc. more books were added. Students and academicians loved the library for its quiet cool ambience and the easy access to information for their projects. Keeping pace with technology, the cyber centre and audio-visual centre were created in 1999.

Over the last two decades, the Nehru Centre Library has emerged as a popular information resource centre for all subjects. Today, we have 30,000 books, subscribe to 75 journals, 16 newspapers, have about 260 + documentation subjects and a well-configured cyber centre. We regularly organise book discussions, workshops and meet-the-author sessions. Our user friendly Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is easily accessible on the Internet.

The library has always been a place buzzing with activity. Researchers and students love the space, while poring through books on science and society, art, philosophy, culture and allied disciplines. It is a hybrid library with both print and digital information resources and is Mumbai's premier public reference library.
